Dear Ms. Bowen:

Recently, Penn's Trail Environmental, LLC (PTE) was requested to perform a plant and habitat study for the above referenced project on behalf of Lower Frederick Township. The township had received a review letter from DCNR indicating potential plant impacts on or along the proposed improvement project footprint. A single plant species of special concern (SOSC) was listed (Nodding Trillium/*Trillium cernuum*). A copy of your comment letter, USGS map, (directions to site attached), and the PNDI review receipts showing project footprint and approximate photo locations is enclosed to aid in your review of our study. Color photos of the study area are included as part of this submission. Also, a current copy of the surveyors Wild Plant Management Permit is enclosed.

PTE conducted a site investigation of the entire project footprint in late April 2014. The project footprint is broken up into two separate areas. Area 1, herein referred to as the Perkiomen Pump Station, is correlated to PNDI receipt # 20140306441462. Area 2 is referred to as the Goschenhoppen Interceptor and is correlated to PNDI # 20140306441484.

Area 1 consists mostly of floodplain and open canopy woods. Some areas of wetlands were observed on the west side of the Perkiomen Creek (see photos 1-6). Although the SOSC target habitat was described as preferring moist woods; it is our opinion that habitat did not occur in study area 1. No rocks or boulders were observed in the study area and the herbaceous layer was dominated by Greater celandine (*Chelidonium majus*). SOSC were not observed during our survey of this area. The east side habitat of the Perkiomen Creek was mostly top of bank and upland deciduous forest (Photos 7 through 11).


Area 2 consists of undeveloped upland deciduous forest and riparian corridor habitats along the Goschenhoppen Creek. No wetland associated with the Creek was observed during our survey. Photos 12 through 14 show the east side of the Creek and it's typical dense understory forest habitat along the creek closest to Zieglersville Road and up toward Township Well #7 (see attached photo location maps). Photos 15 through 17 show the maintained areas around Township Well # 7 (east side of the creek). Photos 18 & 19 show the Goschenhoppen Creek habitat at Zieglersville Road. Photos 20 through 24 show typical habitat observed along the west side of the Goschenhoppen Creek. Photos 25 & 26 show the upland meadow habitat along the west side of the creek. Photos 27 & 28 show Goschenhoppen Creek at Salford Station Road. The remaining Photos (29 through 34) show typical top of bank, agricultural and other maintained habitats that was observed during the survey (on both east and west sides of the creek). SOSC were not observed during our survey of this area of study.

During our survey, the listed species was not observed. Although wetlands and moist conditions were observed within an open canopy wooded habitat in Area 1, no rocks, boulders or outcrops were observed within the project footprint. It is our position that the appropriate land type and habitat does not exist for the listed species.

The PNDI receipt map showing both the project footprints (area 1 and 2) are included with photo locations to aid in your review (no formal site plan was available at the time of our survey and this submission). Please advise if your agency feels further information is required or if an on-site evaluation is warranted. Thank you for your time and consideration in this matter and we look forward to hearing from you.


No Impact Anticipated as per Survey

PNDI records indicate species or resources under DCNR's jurisdiction are located in the vicinity of the project. DCNR requested a survey for *Trillium cernuum* on 20 March 2014. A survey was conducted by Maureen McDermott in late April 2014. No species of special concern were found on the project site. Therefore, DCNR has determined that no impact is likely. No further coordination with our agency is needed for this project.

ORDINANCE NO. (not adopted)

AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING THE INSTALLATION, USE,
MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF GRINDER PUMPS

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Lower Frederick Township as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 123 of the Lower Frederick Township Code is hereby amended by adding the following Article IX Sections 123-78 thru 123-84:

§123-78 Definitions.

Unless the context specifically and clearly indicates otherwise, the meaning of terms used in this Part 3 shall be as follows:

- (1) "Act 537 Plan" shall mean a Municipality's Official Plan as defined in the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, Act of January 24, 1966, P.L. 1535(1965), No. 537, as amended, 35 P.S. §§750.1-750.20a ("Sewage Facilities Act" or "Act 537")
- (2) "Department" shall mean the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection.
- (3) "Grinder Pump" shall mean any electric motor driven, submersible, centrifugal pump capable of macerating all material found in normal domestic sanitary sewage, including reasonable amounts of objects, such as plastics, sanitary napkins, disposable diapers, rubber and the like, to a fine slurry, and pumping this material through a small diameter discharge.
- (4) "Improved Property" shall mean any property within the Township upon which there is erected a structure intended for continuous or periodic habitation, occupancy or use by human beings or animals and from which structure sewage shall or may be discharged.
- (5) "Official Plan Revision" shall mean a change in the Municipality's Act 537 Plan to provide for additional or newly identified future or existing sewage facilities needs, as defined fully in Section 1 of the Sewage Facilities Act, 35 P.S. § 750.1 which may include one or more of the following:
 - (i) "Update revision" shall mean a comprehensive revision to an existing official plan required when the Department or municipality determines the official plan or one or more of its parts is inadequate for the existing or future sewage facilities needs of a municipality or its residents or landowners.
 - (ii) "Special study" shall mean a study, survey, investigation, inquiry, research report or analysis which is directly related to an update revision. The

studies provide documentation or other support necessary to solve specific problems identified in the update revision.

- (iii) "Revision for new land development" shall mean a revision to a municipality's official plan resulting from a proposed subdivision as defined in the act.
- (iv) "Special study" shall mean a study, survey, investigation, inquiry, research report or analysis which is directly related to an update revision. The studies provide documentation or other support necessary to solve specific problems identified in the update revision.
- (6) "Property Owner" shall mean any person vested with ownership, legal or equitable, sole or partial, of any property located in the Township.
- (7) "Sewage" shall mean any substance that contains any of the waste products or excrement or other discharge from the bodies of human beings or animals and any noxious or deleterious substance being harmful or inimical to the public health, or to animal or aquatic life or to the use of water for domestic water supply or for recreation or any substance which constitutes pollution under the Clean Stream Law, 35 PS §§ 691.1-691.1001, as amended (35 PS §§691.1-691.1001).

§123-79. Planning Requirements.

The connection of existing properties or proposed new land development to an existing or proposed sewerage system through the use of sewage grinder pumps and any associated force mains or low-pressure laterals to an existing sewerage system shall occur only after an Official Plan Revision to the Township's Act 537 Plan, or an exemption from sewage facilities planning have been, approved by both the Township and Department, that designates that the proposed properties be served by such a connection. A connection may also occur if DEP has determined that sewage facilities planning is not required for the connection.

§123-80. Powers of the Township.

The Township is hereby authorized and empowered to adopt such rules and regulations concerning sewage which it may deem necessary from time to time to effect the purposes herein.

The Township is hereby authorized and empowered to take such other actions as are necessary, including, but not limited to, entering into agreements with property owners that assures proper operation and maintenance of sewage facilities within the Township's borders, including but not limited to, sewage grinder pumps and any associated force mains or low-pressure laterals.

§123-81. Duties and Responsibilities of the Township.

- (1) The Township shall exercise its powers and legal authority set forth herein, and under all applicable statutes, ordinances, and other laws to effect the purposes of this ordinance.
- (2) The Township may enter into an agreement with each property owner proposing to install or who has installed a sewage grinder pump or low pressure sewage system to assure the short-and long-term operation and maintenance, use, service, repair or replacement of such systems.
- (3) All grinder pumps and low pressure sewer systems (and the installation, use, operation, maintenance, service, repair service and replacement thereof) shall comply with the rules and regulations of the Township in effect from time to time.
- (4) All grinder pumps and low pressure sewer systems shall be connected to the sewage collection and conveyance system in full compliance with the rules and regulations of the Township in effect from time to time.
- (5) The Township shall bear no responsibility for the purchase, installation, use, operation, repair, maintenance, service, repair, or replacement of the grinder pump and/or its low pressure force main or lateral, except as otherwise set forth herein.

§123-82. Duties and Responsibilities of Others.

- (1) Each Property Owner served by a grinder pump shall bear full responsibility for providing, installing, using, operating, maintaining, servicing, repairing and replacing his/her grinder pump and/or its low-pressure force main or lateral, unless otherwise set forth herein.
- (2) Each Property Owner served by a grinder pump shall have full responsibility for using the pump consistent with the manufacturer's instructions and shall avoid introducing into the sewerage system materials that may damage the impellers on the pump, including, but not limited to, items designated as not biodegradable in septic tanks.
- (3) Each Property Owner served by a grinder pump shall close the sewage system and cease operations during any period when the grinder pump and/or low-pressure system serving a property is inoperable for more than ____ days.
- ~~(4) Where the low pressure force main or lateral is shared between Property Owners, they shall submit to the Township a Declaration of Easements, Covenants and Restrictions in recordable form setting forth the agreement of each benefitted Property Owner with respect to the installation, use, operation, use and maintenance, service, repair and replacement of the low pressure sewer system, which agreement shall bind all future Property Owners. Following the approval of the low pressure system by all applicable agencies, the Township will not issue a permit for its installation until evidence is presented that the agreement has been recorded in the Office for the Recording of Deeds of Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.~~

§123-83. Abatement of Nuisances.

In addition to any other remedies provided in this ordinance, any violation of subsections §123-81 and §123-82 above shall constitute a nuisance and shall be abated by the Township

by seeking either mitigation of the nuisance or appropriate equitable or legal relief from a court of competent jurisdiction.

§123-84. Rules and Regulations to be in Conformity with Applicable Law.

All such rules and regulations adopted by the Township to effectuate this ordinance Agency shall be in conformity with the provisions herein, all other ordinances of the Township, and all applicable laws, and applicable rules and regulations of administrative agencies of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 2. -Repeal. All ordinances or resolutions or parts of ordinances or resolutions, insofar as they are inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3 -Severability. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections, or parts of this ordinance, it being the intent of the Township that such remainder shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.


Section 4 -Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after enactment.






