Parks Inventory: At the August meeting the board discussed providing an updated inventory of all parks and open space in the Township. See page 2 for the detailed list.

Lower Frederick Township Open Space/Parks

1. Underkoffler Cemetery - Zieglerville Road
2. Second Street Park - 1976, 1.378 acre acquisition. To be left in natural state except for placement of picnic facilities and necessary site preparation
3. Toto Property - Cuddy Park 12.365 acre parcel on Colonial Drive. To be maintained as open space in accordance with the MC open space program. It is to be an active neighborhood park with playing fields and other active accessories
4. Coble Park - 1981 Jubb, purchased with Federal Land and Water Acquisition grants, and state fund, as well as Township. To be held and used for Permanent Park and Recreation. Active recreation including ball fields, basketball and tennis courts and parking was included in grant application
5. War Memorial - Route 29 and 73.
6. 7.6 acres in Cedar Hill donated for open space/recreation by developer. Tot lot and ½ basketball court at Goshen, open space on Laureen, wooded open space in between Berger and Grimley
7. Colonial Drive/Salford Station Road Park - 22 acres on the corner. The front open area is for active recreation, the woodlands are to be preserved, however walking trails thru the woods are permitted
8. Foy Park - 7.05 acres purchased from fire company, on Main Street. To be used for passive recreation, walking trails, nature study. Accessory structures which are recreational in use and relate to open space may be constructed
9. Stone Hill - Meng/Delphi Road area consisting of Furia property 23 acres, Diesinger property - 23 acres, Bradley - 5.66 acre property and property owned by the Audubon Society. To be left in natural state, public is allowed access
10. The Diesinger tract, which is part of the Stone Hill properties allows for playing fields and parking lot
