

## Goshen Road Natural Preserve

Located off Goshen Road in Cedar Hill Development, Perkiomenville, Pa.



**Jack in the Pulpit (*Arisaema triphyllum*) Found at Goshen Road Preserve**

This parcel is an undisturbed natural wooded area that is a climax forest consisting of primarily oak and hickory. The land has not been logged in approximately 200 years, estimating based on the age of the larger white oaks. This site has high ecosystem value because it has never been farmed or otherwise disturbed. The understory is intact and contains many native plants endemic to such an environment, including maple leaf viburnum, spring beauties, Solomons seal, toothwort (abundant), Virginia bluebells, and more, and little impact from invasive alien species. The site also is nearly free of indications of vandalism or trash.

### Area Amenities:

Undeveloped parcel to be maintained in its natural state;

Nice walking/sitting area;

Native wildflower species, and

Wildlife observation –fox, deer, groundhogs and a large variety of birds can be found here.
